ARTICLE 3. CREW

3.3 Club Membership

Crew, Passengers and Service Crew who intend to travel in or drive the nominated vehicle must be members of a Motorsport Australia affiliated car club. If any member of a Crew, Passenger or Service Crew requires membership of a car club, membership is available with the Classic Rally Club for the fee of \$24 and will remain current for the duration of the Event.

ARTICLE 7. THE EVENT

7.4 Event Start

The Event Start will be held on Friday 28th October 2022.

Location:

Time: 5:30 am

The first car is scheduled to start at precisely 6:30 am. All vehicles are required to present to the Start from 5.30am and be lined up in Starting Order as defined by the Organisers.

Breakfast will available from 5.30am.

ARTICLE 8. Roadbook

8. Roadbook

The Event will be fully route charted using distances, tulips and associated instructions. Route

Redirections are included as part of the Roadbook and will only be used if instructed to do so by the Clerk of the Course.

Crews choosing to follow any other route other than the fully route charted route, including any Route Redirection mentioned in the Roadbook, do so at their own risk as no Event Support can be provided. Under these circumstances, Crews must inform the Organisers/CRO/Control Officials of their intention to do so prior to travelling on any other intended route.

Crews are permitted to carry general maps of the areas to be traversed. GPS devices are allowed and recommended.

ARTICLE 9. MANDATORY EQUIPMENT

Service Crews are to carry Sat Phones.

Service Crew are strongly recommended to carry Mandatory Equipment.

9.1 First Aid Kits

A first aid kit must be carried in the passenger compartment of all vehicles including Service vehicles and be within reach of Crew/Service Crew.

9.2 Emergency Items

The following emergency items are to be carried in vehicles at all times and should be within reach of Crew/Service Crew:

ARTICLE 12. ACCIDENT/INCIDENT PROCEDURES

12.1 Crew to Report ALL Accidents/Incidents

Crews are required to report any incident or injury involving a Crew, Passenger or Service Crew and any member of the Public, and any/or any damage to a participating vehicle during the Event. Such reports are to be made by crews on the Incident Report in the Roadbook and;

- the report must be lodged with an Official at the Event, and
- the report must be lodged no later than two (2) hours after the involved Crew's arrival time at the end of the section in which the incident occurred.
